The 2007 Session

At its Fall congregational meeting, the congregation elected six members of the church to join the session for 2007. Elder Walt Brown (Outreach) will be starting a second term. Elder Broady Cook (Property) will be rejoining the session, having served as a ruling elder previously. Joining them in the "Class of 2009" will be Mary Ann Vergith (Personnel) and Brian Parker (Stewardship). Randy Cook (Worship) was elected for a two-year term to fill a vacancy, and Mary Renico (Christian Ed) will be serving a one-year term to fill a second vacancy.

Please, pray for the session in the coming year. The year 2007 will be a year of transition, and the session will have many important decisions to make and duties to carry out. And, when you see one of these six individuals thank them for being willing to take on the responsibilities of being a ruling elder at this important time in the life of the church.

Elders' Convocation

The year 2007 will be a year of transition for Holly PC. The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) is working zealously to find a candidate for our pulpit, and there is every reason to hope that our new pastor should be with us by the end of 2007.

In the meantime, the church has a good deal to do to prepare for the next pastor. The session and its committees will undertake many different tasks during the year. One of those tasks is to call for at least two Elders' Convocations. The purpose of each convocation is to prepare ourselves for revising & working with our next minister. The session invites all ordained elders to participate. Other members are also welcome.

The first convocation will be held on Sunday afternoon, January 21st, from 2:00 until 4:00. It's theme is "Where we are & where we're going."

It's original intention was to provide the seed money for carrying out needed capital improvements for our facilities. 



Selecting the right gift for a special someone is Personal belongings and family heirlooms have so sometimes joyous, sometimes a chore. Give a gift much to say. Have yours told their stories yet? They that's free. A gift that no one else could give. A gift of will be welcome and engaging gifts. Here are some your legacy!

Consider giving to or requesting a very personal, one-of-a-kind gift this year: heirloom stories. A perfect gift for an adult child who has everything. A perfect gift to request from aging parents who don't know what to give. A daughter knew that the quilt protected in her mother's cedar chest was her great grandmother's. But until her mother recorded the story of the quilt she did not know how dear it really . was. The quilt was a wedding present received the day before her newly married great grandparents climbed onto a covered wagon in Pennsylvania to begin their journey westward to Colorado and a new life. Protected and hand carried across the U.S. the quilt bumped for a thousand miles along the Santa Fe Trail with a wagon train. That quilt is now much more cherished.

People forget that they live in their homes with history all around them. Old tools, equipment and machinery have a history all their own. A woman's gloves, hat or shoes describe an era never to be seen again. Most of the stories go untold, leaving generations without the knowledge of an item's uniqueness, history or sentimental value. History lessons and family stories can be integrated, enjoyed & remembered by any age recipient.

ideas to help you tell those heirloom stories:

- Tell them to someone who will act as your scribe.
- Write them down in longhand or on a typewriter or computer.
- Record them on a tape recorder in your own voice.
- Have someone videotape you while you hold an item and tell its story or demonstrate its use.

Even a person with Alzheimer's Disease can often share the stories that others may think are lost. If she can still speak, put an item in her hand, and it may remind her of events or uses, people or places. Ask her questions, and you may get more history than you expected.

Start now to preserve those stories, histories and ways. Give or request a loving legacy for any season or occasion.



We will take the offering on Sunday, December 24th at both the morning service and the evening candle light service. If you prefer, you can also mail in a check to the church making it out to Holly PC and designating it for the Christmas Joy Offering.

The offering goes to two causes. Half goes to supplement the pensions of retired pastors, especially those who retired in earlier years and have smaller pensions. It is important that we can our pastors, who have usually worked with little regard for their own financial well-being, a secure retirement. The other half goes to Presbyterian schools and colleges that specialize in educating ethnic minorities.


