Recently, Colby met with Paige, a sophomore, and was able to talk through the basics of the gospel with her. Here's a snippet of a text conversation Colby had with Paige following their appointment:

Hey Colby, sorry to get back so late, had a long night of studying. I'd maybe like to chat a bit a little before/after AIA tomorrow night. Just wanted to give a little feedback after how things have been since understanding the KGP [Knowing God Personally gospel booklet]. Hey Paige, thanks for being willing to give feedback...always open to it...I really want to hear your thoughts.

Okay, no problem, I'll give you a little feedback tonight and if I feel like I want to talk more we can figure out a meeting.

Wanting to give "feedback" is not something we necessarily hear our students volunteering to do! So when Colby received these texts he was quite curious about what Paige might say. Did he offend her? Were her feelings hurt in some way? What had he done wrong?! Well to his pleasant surprise, Paige wanted to tell him that when he shared the gospel with her, even though she had grown up around the church, she understood God's grace for her for the first time. She talked of the freedom she had found that week in not trying to "perform" for God. That when she made a mistake, or didn't spend time with Him, she didn't have to "make it up to Him" in some way. His love for her is constant no matter her performance. How refreshing! We'll take that feedback any day…praise God!
