And with the lame man by the pool, I see Him radically initiating into the life of that man and reminding me that His work in my life is a work of His sheer grace. It is like I am falling in love with God all over again as I see Him reflected in these pages. My prayer is that God will use His Word in a similar way with the students as they read John this semester, drawing them into deeper relationship with Him. Thank you for your partnership which allows us to walk alongside these student-athletes as they journey with Jesus.
