Lacrosse Explosion

Pretty much ever since Colby and I arrived on campus at Michigan in 2009 we have been trusting God to move and work on the women's lacrosse team, as there was NOBODY involved from that team, EVER. Well, (and you can guess where this story is going!) this year there has been a mini revival on the lacrosse team with almost half of the 35 women on the team involved in or checking out AIA!

It all started a year and a half ago when I met Erin, a now junior on the team. She showed up to our 2022 AIA kick off party after having been invited by her friend on another athletic team. I got to know Erin throughout that year and it was apparent that she was a young believer who had a strong desire to grow in her faith.

When it came time to choose student leaders for this school year, I felt like God was asking me to challenge Erin to leadership. She was super nervous to take that step of faith, but with some coaxing, Erin said yes and began leading a weekly discipleship group with her team in September.

I don't think any of us could have envisioned what is going on spiritually with Erin's lacrosse team now! In Erin's words, it has "become a norm" to talk about faith and discipleship group now amongst the team members. All four of the senior captains come to Erin's group, with two of them never having been exposed to Christianity before. Responding to Erin's individual regular invitations, more and more girls are coming to check things out...and are being exposed to God's Word!

Of course she is disappointed she is having to walk this road of recovery, but now she is looking for God's hand and perspective in it. Erin has told me that the way Rylee is walking through this injury with the Lord is having a huge impact on her teammates. God really is so faithful and He can make a way where there seems to be no way forward! All glory to Him for drawing these women to Himself and using sweet Erin in the process!
