# **INTERIM NOTES**

On Saturday morning, March 17th, members of the session from the past three years, 2005-2007, and I sat down together to talk about the last two years of the interim period. We discussed together how the church has changed in the time that Runee and I have been with you, and we talked about the road ahead.

Various members of those three sessions expressed their feeling that by 2007 both the session and the church have achieved an improved sense of direction and a feeling of having a common goal. They felt that there is improved communication between the session and the rest of the church and better communication within session itself. There seemed to be general agreement that from this point on the session and other lay leaders in the church need to be "proactive." that is taking leadership rather than waiting to be led by others.

Several elders said that the interim period has helped the church understand its situation, and it has given the session more confidence in itself and the church that together you can meet the challenges it now

faces. The renovation of the narthex. while costly, has been one of the most important accomplishments of the last two years. It is a reasonable risk that has paid the church major "dividends" in ways none of us could have foreseen.

Looking to the fu-


ture, it was felt that the one big item on the church's plate today is addressing the ongoing need for change. There are still some members who worry about taking risks and feel reluctant to seek further change. Still. the congregation has momentum and direction; and it is imperative to maintain that momentum into the future. Those present Saturday morning understood clearly that the session and church now have to work to keep moving; it is no longer a matter of waiting for the next minister to come and "save" the church.

So, we come to the time we knew from the beginning would come and come soon, the time for good-byes. Runee and I are headed to a church in the Lansing area, Delta Presbyterian Church. We look forward to the challenges we will face there, but we will miss HPC and the many

good friends we have in it. Our prayer for HPC is that it will discover that person God intends for it, a pastor who has the skills HPC needs and a vision for working with a church that faces a challenging but potentially exciting future. If you find such a pastor and if you build a strong, trusting relationship with her or him-if you "go with the flow" of the Spirit—what a meaningful future it will be!

And if you should happen to be over in Lansing. Sunday afternoon. June 17th, you are cordially invited to attend my Service of Installation at Delta Presbyterian Church (6100 W. Michigan Ave.). We hope to see you there.
