MONEY AND THE CHURCH'S FUTURE



The greatest challenge facing us as a church in 2007

is to open ourselves individually and as a church to God's leading. We believe that the church's central purpose remains to worship God and be an instrument of the Good News for Holly and the surrounding area. How well we do these things depends on several factors, not just one or two. Among those factors is money. In order to do God's work, we have to have an income. It's as simple as that.

Even if it is simple, however, we need to emphasize that the church has to have money not to "get by" but to be effective in doing God's will.

This is important to remember as we look at the pledging facts for 2007. As of January 15th, the session has received 40 pledges totaling just over \$80,000. As a result the session has had to draw up a revised 2007 budget, which still shows a shortfall of \$50,000. There was a similar shortfall, although not as large, in 2006, and it needs to be emphasized that the shortfall is caused by major expenses that the session cannot control, especially the pastor's salary. In 2006, the operating budget used by the session itself showed a small net balance for the year. In spite of a very active, fruitful year, session did not use all that it had available to it for conducting the programs of the church.

As a church, we have serious decisions to make about the financial state of the church. If we decide that the church has to start cutting back on expenses and economize, we will be taking dangerous step backwards. We all share a vision for a growing church, but one of the things we have to have to grow the church is money and not a little of it. If we skimp on the church's finances, we will only end up killing the church. A "frugal church" is one that lacks vision, faith, and courage. Frugality inspires no one. Worse, it starts every discussion with money rather than faith.

So, what can we each do?

2007: A Year for Change & Growth

As most of us know, HPC will be without pastoral leadership for a part of this coming year. Session, however, has laid plans for numerous meaningful activities during the year. If these plans bear fruit, HPC will be a substantially stronger church by the end of the year.

Four events are of special importance. On MARCH 31st the Christian Education Committee is hold a LENTEN CHILDREN'S FAIR, which is aimed at bringing children from the church & community together for a time of fun and learning. On DECEMBER 8th the CE Committee will sponsor the ADVENT FAMILY FAIR, similar in some ways to the one the church held last year. Our goals are to provide our own children with Christian education and fellowship activities involving lots of other kids, to provide fun activities for other children, and to become known in Holly as the church that cares for children.

The other two events were described in

this month's lead article. They are the two gala fundraisers, one to be held in May and the other in October.

These four events address two of the most serious issues facing our church in 2007. The first issue is that of how to provide a strong, fun Christian education program especially for our children when we have so few children. The second question we face is that of obtaining the financial resources we need to sustain an active, vital life and program. Put most bluntly, HPC needs children and it needs money. These four events are a good start in meeting both of those needs.

THE KEY TO SUCCESS for all four events is wide participation by the members of the church. If you give time, energy, enthusiasm, and prayer to these events, they will prove to be a blessing to the church. As the church motto puts, "Believe! It's just what we do." ■


I'm excited and hopeful for you for the coming twelve months. We all hope and pray that the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) will be able to proceed expeditiously to finding a candidate for the pulpit; but even if HPC does not have a pastor by December it will be a good year for the church.

The thing every member and friend of Holly PC should keep in mind is that the final earthly responsibility for the life of the church does not rest with the minister but with the whole church. Your next pastor cannot lead where you will not go. A capable minister can do little in an incapacitated church. It is vital, therefore, that the whole church show the strength of its own leadership and the depth of its own commitment; and 2007 provides you with an excel-

lent opportunity to do just that.

When a church is between pastors, more often than not, things slow down and the church goes "quiet" (comatose might be a better word!). Giving drops off. Attendance goes down. Not too much more than the bare bones routine takes place. Things "start over" and "start up" only when the new minister arrives. In this case, HPC has issues to face and challenges to meet, and it will be much better for the church if it gets on with its life now.

Let me share with you all the hope I shared with the session at its last meeting—that HPC will be moving full steam ahead when your next pastor arrives to the point that she or he has to make a running leap to get on board. That can happen only if the session and other lay leaders lead well and the whole church follows just as well.—Herb



PNC UPDATE

The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) continues to work on finding our next pastor. The Church Information Form, after being reviewed and modified a few times, has now been approved both by our session and by the presbytery. Early this month it was entered into the PC(USA) database. So we should start seeing information from potential new pastors fairly soon.

Meanwhile, after a Christmas hiatus, the PNC has begun meeting again. We are looking at ways to ramp up our meeting schedule, as we will soon be dealing with information from (we hope) a lot of candidates. Keep us in your prayers--Jim Lyles, PNC Chair

We are 4 years old!

The average age of a coffeehouse ministry like ours is 1 year. Our numbers have far exceeded our projections, and we continue to be one of the most popular venues for rock and acoustic music in the area.

Music brings the people we are reaching out to, in the door and we have relational ministry - loving, listening, praying with, as well as Bible study in a discussion format. This year we have had more Christian bands, and solo artists which brings witness right from the stage. Our early years saw some of this, but we were careful not to have too religious an atmosphere up front which might keep away the very nonreligious people we are here for. From our popular image, we are now able to be a bit more up front with our witness from the stage, and more band members and fans have been commenting on their Christian spiritual growth.

We recently had Patrick Kelly sing and speak. Patrick was in the popular national band "Chiodos", but dropped out when his faith was being compromised by being in the band. It was amazing to see 40 students sitting quietly on the floor listening to Patrick.



Our acoustic nights at Borders Books and Music on Miller Road have put us in contact with many new seekers of truth, and believers as well. We have been able to be a Christian witness there in a new and beautiful way. These are on the second Friday each month.

Here are some ideas:

First, pray for your church that it might continue to be a church that is alive to God's leading—a church with a purpose and a deep desire to fulfill that purpose.

Second, if you have pledged for 2007, please go back and look at that pledge. Is there room for \$25 or \$50 or more a month in your pledge? If we each added something each month to our pledge it would add to the church's income, which is a start towards dealing with the deficit the church

faces.

If you have been intending to pledge and haven't done so yet, please get your pledge in as soon as possible—and maybe add a little more to the amount you originally thought you'd give.

Third, the Stewardship Committee is planning to do two major fund raising events during 2007. A task force is now being set up. The thought at this point is to have a coordinated set of activities running at the same time on a Saturday in the spring. These activities could include a car show,

silent auction, ice cream social, garage sale, sock hop, or other events. Given enthusiasm, creativity, hard work, and good advertising, these events could bring in a substantial amount of income. One suggestion has been to give a part of the profit to a worthy local cause so that these events would be fellowship, evangelistic, and outreach opportunities rolled into one.

You can help! We need ideas. We need heads, hands, & feet. We need prayerful support. The new chair of the Stewardship Committee is Elder Brian Parker. The other

members of the committee are Christine Cook, Peggy Ranger, and Vicki Lyles. If you have ideas and if you can help, please, contact one of them.

Fourth and finally, let's not be lax in giving once Herb leaves. In 2004, when Jack left, church giving dropped off substantially. We missed a great chance to build up a bigger balance to meet future expenses. Let us not make the same mistake twice!!

In all of these ways, we can work together to make HPC the kind of church we want it to be. Amen!


