


You will need:

string, white glue




How to:

Dear Friends,

As I sit here and think about GRACE., I do so with many mixed emotions.

It has been one year since the City has cut off our funding. At the same time, we were informed that United Way had no more money. This left us with no funding at all!

At that time I thought it probably would be better to close, but my heart hurt for the many poor souls who need us.

We had so many calls at that time. The people of this community said "Don't worry we will all help you. You cannot close." So we didn't.

There were five businesses that came up with a large donation for us, and we appreciate that. We have roughly ten families that help us on a monthly basis. Some are \$5.00, some \$20.00 and one \$200.00. We thank all of you. We had five churches that helped us, but now three of them have cut back for their own building projects. Everyone has been wonderful with donations of clothing, etc.

All this talk gets me to one point. We need monetary donations on a regular basis. No matter how large or small, we need continued and regular support.

For 50 years I have been going into my own purse to help. I have used my savings, mortgaged, borrowed etc. The car that I drive will attest to where I am financially. The fact remains, I can't do that anymore. I soon will be 75 and have given almost everything I own to the needy.

However I can not stand to see a sick baby without medicine, a child with a toothache or an elderly person with no place to go. So with no thought to my own finances, I have been helping people with my money, which is almost gone.

To make matters worse, the apartments are beginning to lower their rent and this brings many more low income into the city. We added 148 families to our caseload in the last year.

Our 2005 Christmas and Thanksgiving and 2006 Easter programs were the biggest ever. We are talking 656 Easter baskets that we gave out this year.

Please find it in your heart to support this effort. I need you more than ever before to carry on my lifelong ministry to the needy.
