FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends.

When we go to a ball game, we get excited, caught up in the game. We see the action of the players, and there is a contagion about being in the crowd and we say, "That's the spirit." We all know what that indefinable thing called school spirit is!

When people come together to work on something, they get a feeling of togetherness, and we say, "That's the spirit." What we know in our experience of "spirit" is the binding together in unity, a lovalty of common ideals or goals, a feeling of togetherness. And that's the spirit!

In our Christian experience, we go a step further and recognize spirit with a capital S. What we know as Holy Spirit is God's activity in our lives, not a vague fleeting feeling, but a vividly felt Presence and Power of God in our hearts, and in relationships, and in historical events and the natural order of things. That's the Spirit!

In the book of Acts, it is recorded that when the believers came together they "were filled with the Holy Spirit". They acknowledged God! God was being known in their lives. It has long been my experience that we moderns have all those same experiences of God, but we fail to acknowledge who it is who is speaking. It can be said that persons of faith are those who know who is speaking! When I struggle with questions of right or wrong, the Spirit educates my conscience so that I can make a Christian response to the pressure of love in my life. That's the Spirit!

It has been my personal experience that when I am in a dilemma and must make a vital decision about life, I am most aware of the Holy Spirit because I am most sensitized to the "felt Presence and Power of God." In worship heights may be reached as humility overwhelms us and we can be most receptive to the workings of the Holy Spirit. That's the Spirit!

When Christians come to the communion table, remembering God in Christ, we are moved by that Spirit. We come to seek a Presence and pray for a Spirit. When we come to that kind of openness, we know the Holy Spirit. We know, then, the experience Paul Tillich describes: "We have been accepted by God even though we are unacceptable."

The classic words of the communion service speak to the Christian experience of Spirit.
"Come to this sacred table, not because you must, but because you may; come to testify not that you are righteous, but that you sincerely love our Lord Jesus Christ, and desire to be his true disciples; not because you are strong, but because you are weak; not because you have any claim on heaven's rewards, but because in your frailty and sin you stand in constant need of heaven's mercy and help; come not to express an opinion, but to seek a presence and pray for a Spirit."

In many and varied ways, the Holy Spirit is acutely active in our lives and we have but to recognize "that's the Spirit".

To play: put your Humming Comb between your lips and hum your favorite






Shoebox Lyre
