WINTER CONGREGATIONAL MEETING – February 21, 2010

The winter congregational meeting of the Holly Presbyterian Church in Holly, Michigan, was opened with prayer by moderator Rev. Bill Robertson in the church sanctuary at II:45 a.m., immediately following Sunday worship, on February 21, 2010.

Roll was taken and a quorum established with 33 active members in attendance.

A motion to approve the docket was sustained.

The statistical portion of the Clerk of Session report is summarized as follows: Membership on December 31, 2008 was 116. There were 11 gains and 8 losses, resulting in 119 members on December 31, 2009. 2 children were baptized and there was 1 wedding. The Session in 2009 was made up of 12 Ruling Elders (5 female and 7 male). All were Caucasian.

Randy Cullen wrote the Pastor's Report. He spoke of how the church has survived and continued to minister to the community during one of the most difficult economic times since the great depression. He talked about the 150th anniversary celebration in July and all the people who worked hard to make it a big success. He commented that the congregation and session have learned to work well together to become even stronger in the ministry of the church. He spoke fondly of his two years with us, and expressed confidence that with the new PNC, interim pastors, session, and office manager God has challenging yet hope-filled plans for our growth and our presence in the community.

Vicki Lyles presented the Treasurer's report. In 2009 the church had \$123,717 in ordinary income and \$132,099 in ordinary expenses, which translates to a net loss of \$8,382. At the end of 2009 the church's total assets were \$16,257, but this amount is offset by a loan from presbytery, the balance of which is \$20,910.

Jennifer reported on the findings of the Part-Time Pastor Task Force that she chaired. The task force recommended leaving the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) with the option of either a part-time or full-time pastor. Also the task force felt PNC should have the option of calling someone part-time with the option of later changing to full-time. It was suggested the minimum work level would be 2/3- or 3/4-time, but some still felt we should go to full-time only. One thing that the committee felt was clear: a yoked pastorate would not work for us.

After a long discussion, it was moved that the Pastor Nominating Committee be directed to go after a full-time candidate, or a ¾-time candidate willing to become a full-time candidate. Further discussion ensued, until it was finally ended by a sustained motion to end debate and vote. The motion was then sustained by a vote of 18-11. It was made clear by the congregation that the PNC should NOT consider candidates that are unwilling to become full-time pastors.

Standing committee reports were presented. Here are some highlights:

Christian Education, Brian Murphree & Judy Merritt:

- A Valentine Fair was held in February to bring in families from our congregation and the community.
- o The 2008-2009 Sunday School year ended with an enjoyable potluck/picnic.
- The 2009-2010 year was kicked off with a new curriculum called DiscipleLand for the preschool and elementary Sunday School classes.

- The 2009-2010 year included the transition from the rotating and sign up teaching model to the traditional classroom setting, as this is more conducive to the new curriculum.
- For the 2009-2010 year the tweens and teens were combined and began a new video study called 24/7. An interactive DVD study called *Christ Up Close and Personal* will be starting soon.
- Rev. Cullen led two adult studies during the year on the books *The Heart of Christianity* and *The Jesus I Never Knew*.
- The Sunday School classes ended 2009 with a Christmas program conducted by the kids.

Congregational Care, Kay Vander Kuy, Beth Dryer:

- o Coffee Hour: coffee, juice and snacks were provided each week for Sunday service.
- o Get well cards, Christmas cards, and simply hello cards to current and former members of our congregation.
- A potluck on Ash Wednesday, a soup and bread supper on Maundy Thursday, a bring a friend to dinner potluck on March 15, a 150th anniversary celebration in July and an international potluck held in conjunction with World Communion in October.
- o A graduation tea in May for the 5 graduating seniors.
- o A bake sale and quilt raffle for Carry Nation weekend in September.
- o Snoop Parties in February and November.
- o A reception following the Fenton Ambassadors concert in December.
- o Poinsettias for 9 shut-in members.
- o Garage sale in May. The proceeds (\$1,300) went to the church's general fund.
- o Reunion with a Cause donations were collected from the congregation in July/August.
- o VG's grocery store receipts were collected throughout the year and turned them in with the proceeds (\$419) going to the church.
- o Provided several funeral dinners, bringing another \$456 to the church.
- o Assisted Rev. Cullen in delivering communion to shut-ins on several occasions.

Outreach, Walt Brown & Ardath Regan:

- o Arranged for the Fenton Ambassadors concert in December.
- o One Great Hour of Sharing collection in April.
- o Christmas Joy Offering in December.
- o The annual Christmas Adopt-A- Family event was once again a big success. This year we adopted two families, each with three family members.
- We continued to provide financial support for two Campus Crusade for Christ mission programs: Sarah and Colby Keefer and their work with Athletes in Action at the University of Dayton in Ohio; and Alan and DeeDee Iobst and their work preaching the Gospel to Muslims as they cross between Europe and Africa at Algeciras, Spain.
- The Welcome folders and church bookmarks for visitors were continually updated throughout the year.
- O A "Noah's Ark" pamphlet, for use by members when inviting people to come to church, was developed, and will also be inserted in the Welcome folders.
- Another pamphlet was developed for contacting members that have dropped away from regular attendance.
- o Collection of canned goods for a local food pantry.

- The church Website (www.hollypc.org) continues to function well and averages 75 "visits" per day.
- O Creating top-of-the-mind awareness for our church using a limited budget is a major challenge for the committee. Therefore, we have had to limit our publicity in newspapers for special events. We continue to use the *Tri-County Times*' monthly Church Directory to publicize our Sunday school and church service schedules.
- We are a member of the Holly Chamber of Commerce, which allows us to include our brochures in their "Welcome" packages given to new families in the Holly area. There is no charge for this membership.
- o Christmas Joy Offering and One Great Hours of Sharing.

Personnel, Mary Ann Vergith:

- The biggest change in personnel was the resignation of Rev. Randy Cullen. Revs. Ann and Bill Robertson were hired as part-time interim co-pastors, for a commitment of six months.
- Teri Webner also announced her resignation as office manager, effective the end of 2009. Allie Hoover was hired to replace Teri. Teri assisted in finding, interviewing, and then training her replacement.
- All staff received performance reviews in the spring of 2009.

Property, Broady Cook:

- o The fellowship hall was painted in May.
- A pipe on the lower level froze in February, resulting in a flood. The old tile floor was replaced as a result in all areas under the fellowship hall. This was covered by insurance.
- o The east side roof of the fellowship hall was stripped of shingles, 12 sheets of plywood were replaced, and then it was re-shingled. The cost was \$3,500, and was covered by the Pennies from Heaven fund and donations from a special roof material fund drive.
- The boilers: the laws have changed; yearly testing of the safety devices and controls by a licensed mechanical contractor is now required. The boiler under the sanctuary will fail in five years or less.
- o Nash Landscaping is doing snow removal, salting, and grass cutting.

Stewardship, Brian Parker:

- o The 2009 budget had a \$24,000 deficit.
- o Congregational pledges increased by \$2000.
- The actual deficit at the end of the year was \$12,000, which was an improvement from the previous year.
- Fundraising efforts were increased, with the most income generated from the church's 150th anniversary celebration.
- The 2010 budget was approved with modest increases in congregational pledges and no changes in proposed spending except the pastor's and office manager's compensation and funds for the PNC.

Worship, Randy Cook & Gordie Bradshaw:

The 150th church anniversary celebration was a big success, with about 130 people in sanctuary that day.

- Attendance dropped off considerably after Rev. Cullen announced that he would be leaving Michigan at the end of the year and thus would no longer be our pastor. The overall average attendance for 2009 was 55.
- o New hymnals were purchased, paid for by dedications from church members.
- New bibles, matching the hymnals, were purchased for the pews and paid for by a special bible fund drive.
- New sign-in pads were also purchased for the pews, as well as pens embossed with the church's name.
- o Jordan Howe returned to lead a monthly contemporary music service.
- Julia Hull continues as the music/choir director, and has begun playing both the organ and the piano during services. She has led the choir, and during lent and advent, also the chime choir.
- The committee has been cleaning house all year, organizing and weeding through the music collection. Old wax candles were removed and made available for purchase.

A report was received from the Women's Group. They contributed \$375 to the HPC general fund in March. They collected and donated Easter baskets, cellophane wrap and the goodies and toys to go in them and donated it all to the Ennis Foundation of Genesee County. In May they spent \$86 for geraniums to plant around the church. They donated \$100 to Project Graduation at Holly High School. \$40 was donated in December. The group currently has a balance of \$975.

A report was received from the Teens for Christ. In 2009 they had many fun activities as well as service projects. There were 8 teens that regularly attended. They did not go on a mission trip, choosing instead to do local mission for our church families, including raking, weeding, and shoveling. They raised money for hunger relief via the 30 Hour Famine in March. They hosted a blood drive at the church.

A motion to receive all the reports was sustained.

Reverend Bill Robertson closed the meeting with prayer at 1:18 p.m.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss our financial requirements for calling a full-time pastor (both for next year and five years from now).

Roll was taken and a quorum established with 40 active members in attendance. Also in attendance were moderator Rev. Bill Robertson, Rev. Ann Robertson, and C. J. Merriman from presbytery's committee on ministry.

There was a long discussion regarding current income and expenses and the amount of additional income that would be needed to support a full-time minister. It was suggested that all current members look hard at what they are able to give, as even a few per cents more would make a difference. It was suggested that we individually contact those we know who have dropped away from the church and try to get them to start coming again. It was also suggested that we need to step out of our comfort zone and start really trying to reach the unchurched. Someone suggested that each member contact three people and invite them to come, over the next month or so. All this needs to happen now, not after a new minister is found, so that the pastor nominating committee can honestly tell a new pastor that they will be financially supported not just next year but for at least five years.

A resolution that the congregation will do what it takes to support a full-time pastor for at least five years was sustained unanimously.

It was requested that session come up with more specific information regarding what each member needs to do to make this happen.

The purpose of the meeting was 1) to elect an elder to fill a vacancy on session, and 2) to hear the report of the Pulpit Nominating Committee with regard to a potential candidate for pastor and the terms of call.

A quorum was established with 50 active members in attendance.

Jennifer Chanter reported for the Nominating Committee. Judy Studer was recommended to fill a one-year vacancy on session. There were no nominations from the floor. A motion electing Judy Studer to session for a one-year term was sustained. Jim Lyles reported for the Pastor Nominating Committee. Pastor's 2010 Annual Report

The past year has been a blessed one for us as your interim co-pastors. Holly Presbyterian Church is a welcoming and hopefilled community. We feel that we have grown from being strangers to being members of a loving family. This attribute is the foundation of Holly's continuing mission for Christ.

Our acceptance as Co-Pastors has grown from a question "How doest it work" to an answer of "very well thank you!" We have been able to work with and advise the committees of the Session, moderate the Session, prepare and lead worship, provide pastoral care and coordinate programs. As the old saying goes "Two heads are better than one!" As such we have been able to split the work and utilize our individual talents to lead effectively where we have been needed.

During the past year we have officiated at two weddings, several funerals and two baptisms. These baptisms have resulted in two new members for the church. It also brought us closer to the tragedy of war in Afghanistan. Brian Quinn Elliott and Matt Todd are both serving there so the congregation has tried to stay well connected in prayer and with care packages to these two men.

Ann was pleased to plan with the women of the church and lead them in a Women's Retreat. This time was well attended and well received. Ann's only regret was that there was not time for a second one.

At the center and foundation of Christ's community is the Word both taught and preached. In Worship, being a man and a woman we have been able to bring an androgynous understanding of God's Word through our sermons. During Lent, we taught a five week class about discipleship on Wednesday evenings which began with gathering around the table for fellowship and a soup supper.

The theme for the Stewardship campaign was new to this church as it emphasized

each persons love for God rather than meeting a budget. We were encouraged to prayerfully consider what we could and would give to God. "Multiply the Gifts" was also utilized to encourage greater giving in order to provide sufficient funds for a new pastor.

On the first Sunday of Advent, the congregation gathered after worship for a celebration of "The Hanging of the Greens." This was a time for fellowship, chili and many hands "dressed" the church for Advent and Christmas

We participated in community relations through worship services at Holly Woodlands; Good Friday Lenten Service at Davisburg United Methodist Church; Holly Reunion With a Cause cancer walk at the Holly High school; community Thanksgiving service, at Calvary United Methodist Church, and the Dryer Funeral Home Christmas Memorial Service.

Our journey with the people of Holly Presbyterian Church has been a caring and uplifting experience. We have been blessed to be here and will miss you all very much but anticipate a thriving and wonderful ministry for the church under new leadership.

PNC 2010 Annual Report

The pastor nominating committee (PNC) was elected during the December 6, 2009 congregational meeting. The seven members of the PNC were:

Gordon Bradshaw Randy Cook Lori Goldsmith Jim Lyles Margaret Perry Judy Studer Mary Ann Vergith

The PNC began looking at potential candidates for our new pastor early in 2010. We followed the following process:

- 1. We reviewed 134 pastor information forms (PIFs). 77 of these were from women and 57 were from men. 27 of them were self-referrals, which means the candidates found and contacted us. The others came from matches within the PC(USA) CLC database.
- 2. 104 PIFs were eliminated without further action, as they did not represent a good match for our church. We contacted the other 30 and asked for sermon samples.
- 3. Only 15 of the 30 we contacted sent sermons. Some weren't interested. Some just never responded, including (oddly) one who had originally contacted us.
- 4. We listened to sermons from the other 15, and eliminated 13 of them.
- 5. For the two that remained (1 man, 1 woman), we conducted interviews using Skype. (Skype is computer technology. It allows you to see and hear someone at another location. This was much more insightful than a group phone call.)
- 6. At this point, we had a clear "favorite", and we decided to proceed exclusively with this candidate. Next we called her references and conducted interviews with them. Having found no red flags and received plenty of "all systems go" comments, we decided to continue exclusively with this candidate.
- 7. We listened to a "live" sermon, at a neutral pulpit. (That means we arranged to have our

candidate preach at another church, and traveled there to listen to the sermon. You may recall a Sunday in November when all of the PNC members just happened to not be at worship service.)

8. We showed the candidate all around Holly and the surrounding area, and surreptitiously brought here into the church when it was otherwise unoccupied. (There's real cloak and dagger stuff in the last stages of the PNC's work.)

So far, so good. Our frontrunner remained, well, the frontrunner. It was time for a personal interview.

After the interview, we agreed that this candidate was the one we'd recommend to be our next pastor. And at a congregational meeting on January 16, 2011, after meeting with Rev. Dr. Sharlyn Gates and hearing her preach, you agreed unanimously. She will begin her call as our pastor on March 1st.

The money donated at the family fair was combined with some individual donations and used to buy gift certificates for food that were given to our Christmas families.

You do not see a loan payment to Presbytery in December because I do not have a new amortization schedule to be able to assign the interest and principal (the interest rate changes each year). The payment was written in January, and paid on time.

Christian Education Committee

2010 provided continued enrichment for Christian education in our church. This was especially true for the elementary grades. Outreach Committee 2010 Annual Report

Website – The church Website (www.hollypc.org) continues to function well. The AT&T file server that we use provides us with e-mail, a Website with good down load speeds, plus significant, secure offsite storage capacity that allows us to backup important files from our church computer on a weekly basis.

Website Usage Statistics –

The average daily number of "sessions" for 2010 is 81.38. This is up from an average of 75.11 in 2009. A "session" is defined as a series of "hits" to a Website over a specific period of time -- in this case one day -- by one visitor. A "hit" is defined as any successful request to a Web server from a visitor's browser. This means that an average of 81.38 individual visitors logged into our Website each day during 2010.

The average number of pages viewed per "session" in 2010 was 2.5 -- i.e., on average, each worship services and at various community visitor looked at two and a half pages per visit -- which is up from 1.9 pages in 2009. This suggests that visitors are digging into more Website content, including things like the church calendar, Newsletter, pictures of past events, etc. It is also noteworthy that the amount of time each visitor spent perusing our Website is up significantly over 2009: 17 minutes per visit in 2010 vs. 9 minutes in 2009.

2010 involved continuing many of our successful projects from the previous years, including:

Advertising / Promotion – Creating top-ofthe-mind awareness for our church using a limited budget continues to be a major challenge for the committee. Due to the difficult economic times in our area, newspapers that have traditionally welcomed PR releases from churches are now charging for publishing the information.

We continue to use the Tri-County Times' monthly Church Directory to publicize our Sunday school and church service schedules, in addition to our address and contact information. We also run small space advertising in the Times' Easter and Advent church directories to help promote our Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday services and our Christmas Eve service as well as this year's Family Fun Fair. In addition, we sponsored ads in the Reunion With a Cause walk for cancer program and in the Holly High School Project Graduation program.

We are a member of the Holly Chamber of Commerce, which allows us to include our brochures in their "Welcome" packages given to new families in the Holly area, as well as placing a small space ad in their annual directory. Because we are a non-profit organization, there is no charge for this membership.

Projects – The committee continues to maintain and update our "Welcome" brochure's contents and church bookmark, which include a schedule of events on the back. This material can be handed out to visitors at our Sunday events. Ardath Regan developed a "Noah's Ark" pamphlet that can be used by members of the congregation to hand out when inviting people to attend worship, as well as an insert in the "Welcome" folder.

This year, the Committee was able to help several families in need by supplementing the churches monthly discretionary fund as well as finding funds to assist the church office and to help a member who has moved away. [None of the monies were given directly to the persons in need; they were sent to the purchaser, the rental offices and the repair shop.]

Events – The Outreach Committee, with the wonderful donations of the congregation, helped to provide needed school supplies for area students which were given to the various Holly Schools by Holly Youth Assistance in early September. These donated supplies ranged from notebooks needed for each class in each school, to memory sticks for student's use

ranged from notebooks needed for each class in each school, to memory sticks for student's use in their school and home computers.

The committee also thanks the congregation for providing the toiletries put into 65 Christmas stockings along with several extra boxes of dental supplies. These items were also taken to Holly Youth Assistance who then delivered them to various needy families along with food boxes supplied by Holly Kiwanis.

Under the leadership of Judy Studer, a committee member, the Family Fun Fair was held on Saturday, December 5, which allowed families who don't normally attend our church to come in and be part of our Holiday celebrations and help us 'stuff the stockings'. Children were offered games with prizes, ways to make presents for family, a story telling corner and an opportunity to make Christmas decorations and decorate Christmas cookies. In conjunction, freshly made popcorn was handed out and larger crafted holiday decorations were set out for sale. The sale monies went toward grocery gift certificates for our three Adopt-A-Families. The whole congregation, once again, supported, worked at and helped build and tear down the booths for the Fair.

The following evening, on December 6, we had a full house who enjoyed the fifth annual Fenton High School Ambassadors' Christmas concert, which once again helped kick-off our church's Advent season. The Outreach Committee would like to thank the Congregational Care committee for providing cookies, punch, and coffee for the over 100 people attending the concert. The Ambassadors once again used the free-will offering given them to help an area family in need. This year it went toward the medical and funeral expenses of an 8th grade student who had been suffering from cancer.

The committee also organized the Christmas Joy Offering that was collected during the

Christmas Eve communion service on Dec. 24. This offering goes [50%] toward support of retired ministers and their families as well as [50%] to the Presbytery's Racial and Ethnic Education committee.

The Knit Wits, under the leadership of Bev Ponton met a number of times during the year and made a wondrous assortment of items that were sent to the needy – from booties and caps for new-borns in area hospitals, dresses for young girls in Darfur, Africa, to neck and face protective coverings for our troops in the Middle and Far East. The group displayed their works to the congregation during a Sunday Service. Pictures of all the activities listed and displays are on our Website.

The annual Christmas Adopt-A- Family event was once again a big success. This year, due to the difficult economic times, we adopted three families rather than the single family of the past. These families' financial situations were attested to by Kiwanis, who left all their needs up to us to meet. One family consisted of a single mother and five children made up of three sons and two young daughters. The second family consisted of a single mother and her four sons, and the third family was a father, mother and their young son. The congregation generously provided wrapped Christmas gifts of new clothing, boots and shoes, games and toys, as well as a box of food, household supplies and gift certificates at a local grocery store, all of which were delivered to the three very grateful families on Christmas Eve. The family with the four sons aged 11 to 18 needed help with a nonfunctioning computer as well, and Brian Lyles was able to install a working program for them. They were delighted.

Mission Programs – We continued to provide financial support for two Campus Crusade for Christ mission programs: Sarah and Colby Keefer and their work with Athletes in Action at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor; and Alan and DeeDee Iobst and their

work preaching the Gospel to Muslims as they cross between Europe and Africa at Algeciras, Spain.

Outreach Committee make-up -- The 2010 Outreach Committee was made up of Barb Brown, Judy Studer, Walt Brown and Lori Goldsmith. It was co-chaired by Ardath Regan and Gerry Jackson. Barb Brown was voted in as co-chair in September, when Ardath, due to illness, was unable to continue. This position will last one more year. Gerry has finished his term on Session and as the co-chair of the Outreach Committee, and will be succeeded by Judy Studer. Please note that we can certainly use additional committee volunteers, all of whom will be warmly welcomed.
