From the Seminarian's Desk

Dear Friends,

I'm sorry that I wasn't able to write last month, I got quite caught up in many things. This month, I would like to tell you about an experience I had my last day of Theology class. At the end of our discussion the teacher was curious to see if any of the issues that we have discussed over the past year have shook our faith.

I immediately thought about one of the points that I have pushed in my sermons to Holly Presbyterian in the past, about being passionate about God. When I think about this topic in relation to being shaken in our faith, I think about the biblical theme of building your faith on firm ground and the hymn, "My Hope is Built" by Edward Mote. In the refrain it states, "On Christ the solid rock I stand; all other ground is sinking sand," which points to Matthew 7:21-29. I feel that building our faith on solid ground means that we should first build our faith on the commandment to love God and love neighbor.

Taking the first part of that commandment, if we love God and put God first, and not merely our own thoughts about the Triune God but God, God's self, then all other matters shouldn't shake us so far that we lose faith. If our faith is rooted in our passion for loving God, then other matters come secondary to that. We might be shaken, but we will not fall when we put God first.

The Pastors' Corner The Season of Life: A Time to Gather

Stones

The weeks that follow the Day of Pentecost are referred to as "Ordinary Time." These are the weeks between the end of Eastertide and the beginning of Advent, spanning between 27 – 29 Sundays. Have you ever thought about how special Birthdays are for children, especially? Or how much we anticipate Christmas and Easter? If every day were a holiday, then such celebrations – rather than providing a respite from the regular routine – would become ordinary. Advent would lose its anticipatory impact if we celebrated it more than once a year. Christmas would become another "ho, hum" day if we celebrated it every week.

In Christ, however, even the ordinary becomes "extraordinary." God's extraordinary love in Jesus Christ makes all things new. There is wonder to be found even in the most ordinary days, simply because of the marvel of Christ's death and resurrection. God is in our midst.

Each day is a day to be lived, a day to gather the stones from which we will build our new selves. The stones will include ones that are smooth and polished; others that are jagged and rough; some that are large, some that are small; some that are precious and rare, others that are common and ordinary. Such is the nature of our days. Using the stones we gather, the experiences we undergo – the trials and joys, the good and the bad, and, yes, the ordinary – these stones build us into a community, the body of Christ, the church.

The Spirit of God gives each of us a gift, not for personal gain but for the benefit of the entire body of Christ. In turn, the church provides a place that challenges, stretches, encourages, and calls us. Joan Chittister writes in <u>There Is a Season</u>: "I finally come to know that my work is God's work, unfinished by God because God meant it to be finished by me." In this season, let us gather stones together. Every season is the time to build the church. Let us leave no stones unturned as we share our experiences and our gifts as members of the body of Christ here at Holly Presbyterian Church.
