A Letter from Afghanistan

The following is a new letter we received from Matt Todd dated September,15 2010.

Dear Members of Holly PC,

I want to thank you all for the support you have been giving me. Last Wednesday I received the package that you all sent. Everything in it was well received. I shared it with the fellow members of my team and its contents went fast.

This past month has been quite slow. August is the holy month of Ramadan in the Muslim culture. During this time, Muslims are not allowed to eat or drink from sun-up to sun-down so we didn't do a lot of training. The training we did do, we tried to do inside and out of the heat. Thankfully this also put a stop to any attempt of attack. The last attack we had was August 7, right before Ramadan started. Now that it is over, we have had a hard time getting the Afghan soldiers to come to our training.

During this time of lack of training, it has made for me a lot of personal time. Time to do a lot of thinking and reflecting. Time to spend in the gym and most importantly, time with God. I have spent a lot of time trying to figure "What's next?" Cassie is nearing the completion of her schooling and will soon be searching for a call as a minister. During this next year, we will have a lot of big decisions to make, and with God's guidance, we will make the correct ones.

In approximately five and a half weeks, I will be home taking my two week leave. I will be home with my amazing wife, enjoying my time with her,
