The Experience of Waiting on God ...

As I was reflecting on Advent and what to write here that might be something new and different for this season in our lives, I came across an article in the most recent edition of the journal I subscribe to - The Presbyterian Outlook. The article is written by Mark D. Roberts, titled "You too can become an 'Adventophile.'

Roberts says many of the usual things we say about Advent - that it is a time for preparing for the coming of Christ and that the Latin word *adventus* means "coming" or "visit." He reminds us that our Presbyterian "Directory for Worship" tells us that Advent is "a season to recollect the hope of the coming of Christ and to look forward to the Lord's coming again" (W-3.2002a).

But what I liked the most about this article was how Roberts reminds us that Advent is a time of waiting on God and that we should allow ourselves the experience of waiting. He writes: "In Advent, we use our Scripture-shaped imaginations to feel what it was like for the children of Israel to long for a Savior. Also, we get in touch with our own yearning for the future coming of the Lord when he will establish justice, wipe away every tear and bring the fullness of his peace. We pay attention to the experience of waiting on God rather than rushing on to the next religious activity. Thus, Advent leads us to experience our neediness, our hopefulness and our desire for God."

I think most of us will admit that there is much of the secular Christmas that we enjoy being a part of. Rather than our trying to avoid it or compete with it, I invite you to be selective in what you participate in - not because it is wrong, but because it is important for our thirsty spirits to have a little time for the experience of longing for - of waiting for God.

I have purposely chosen to not teach or lead an Advent study this season because, as your pastor, I sense a weariness in you, my congregation. We have just finished the study on the *Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations* and although our strategic planning team will continue working with me on implementing the practices we decided on at the Ingathering Banquet, I feel many of you are ready for a break. So, instead of trying to encourage you to come one evening during the week for an Advent study, I'm inviting you to join me in a daily ritual of breathing, resting, and sitting still with our thoughts on God. Think on these questions:

- Do I long for God to be in my life in a new and bigger way?
- What would it look like if that were to happen?
- This Advent season, what am I hoping for in my personal life, in my community and in the world?
- In Advent, as we light the candles in the Advent wreath, we focus on hope, peace, joy and love.
 Reflect on how the coming of Christ has brought those elements to our life today, but also on how His second coming will finally bring those things to complete reality.

I do strongly encourage you to make the effort to come to worship on Sunday mornings through this season - to be a part of the life of the church, to worship our God with your church family, to enjoy the music, to hear the words from Scripture and sermon that give us hope for the future, that promise God's love and activity in our lives even today and that challenge us to take the light and love of Christ out with us for the week.

May our Advent season be one of joyful preparation for





Many of us are aware that we had to take out a mortgage to finish paying for the narthex remodel, but it doesn't get mentioned often.

We borrowed \$25,000 from the Presbytery in January 2007, to be paid back at the rate of \$200/month for 15 years. The interest rate on this loan adjusts annually, and we have been


