Monie asks the question: "Which is better empty or full?" I agree when she says that we usually prefer full over empty. We don't want our stomachs to be empty. It's not good if our gas tanks are empty! We probably would not even say we prefer to be spiritually empty, right? The beatitudes are so opposite of what our human nature leans toward. "Blessed are the poor in spirit; blessed are those who mourn; blessed are the meek, the hungry and thirsty (in spirit)." We tend to think we are blessed if we have a lot, if we feel happy and strong and ... well ... full! But Monie says "this spiritual poverty sets the tone for Lent. We must be empty before we can be filled with the good things of God."

I was sharing this with Fred and we began to think about how this "fullness" we desire points to how easily we humans are full of ourselves. Our need to be happy, full of food, money, power ... all leads back to our self need, our self focus. Maybe the place where we should be the most empty as we travel on this Lenten Journey is within ourselves.

During Lent we speak of the wilderness or the desert place where we go, not usually in a physical way, but in a spiritual way. The desert fathers and mothers - those monastic, spiritual people who chose to live their lives in seclusion from the rest of the world practiced some things that are good for us to consider.

When we take the time to sit in silence, breathing in and out, emptying our heads of all the thoughts and conversations that clutter our minds, emptying our spirits of our desires and 101 with Rev. Sharlyn meets in her office. All are welcome to attend either class.

It's been busy few months at HPC!

Great progress is being made on the west basement project with the rough plumbing and the electrical being finished. Our building ventilation/dehumidifier system has been installed. The next phase is have the drywall installed and to get the painting done. We hope to see that finished with in the month.

In December, and early January, we

experienced some significant sewer issues that were traced to a problem in the lines below the restrooms downstairs, and at the connection to the main line. Swift action was taken and the flood water was handles and the sewers repaired. We now have a healthy drain system!
