The journey of Lent is ending as we face the cross, and beyond, to the empty tomb. I'm so thankful that, even while we attempt to focus on the somber, serious themes of Lent, we know there will be great joy at the end. In a way, Lent is kind of like dying, and it should be. We are striving to die to our old ways and to rise up in the way of Christ - transformed, renewed and walking with new purpose.

I say that the experience of Lent is a bit like dying because even as we go through that somber, difficult process of dying - literally losing our lives to this world - we who are Easter People have faith that there will be great joy on the other side. I love the liturgy from our Book of Common Worship. In the Service of the Witness to the Resurrection, the commendation says, "You only are immortal, the creator and maker of all. We are mortal, formed of the earth, and to earth shall we return. This you ordained when you created us, saying, "You are dust, and to dust you shall return." All of us go down to the dust; yet even at the grave we make our song: Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!"

We started our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday with those grim words, "you are dust, and to dust you shall return." But now, we end with joy, knowing that because Christ is risen, we too shall rise; we too shall live! Alleluia!

Jesus said, "*I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die.*" (John 11:25-26)

Throughout the Lenten Season, our theme has been ***This Love Changes Everything!***

Oh, how true that is! Because of God's great love for all humanity, shown to us through his Son, Jesus Christ, everything is changed. Jesus' death and resurrection give the promise that while we may die, we will live again forever with him. We have hope that we will be united with our loved ones someday. This love does change everything!

But, there is new life to be experienced even before we actually die a physical death. There are times when we are in such a low place, such a deep pit of despair, so much pain caused by sickness, or broken relationships, or the death of loved one, that it feels somewhat like the grave itself.

But because of the amazing love of God, the beautiful life and sacrifice of Christ, and the gift of the Holy Spirit we can be renewed, restored to a new life that is filled with joy and hope. *This love changes everything!* I pray you are experiencing new changes in your life!

It appears that the latest amendment regarding the definition of marriage has passed by the majority of our presbyteries. In the Narthex of the church, on the small table beside the greeters, you will find a copy of the news article that spells out the amendments and their meanings regarding same-gender marriages and the change in the wording of the Book of Order. The article's heading just says Advisory Opinion, Approved Amendment of W-4.9000.


Presbyterian Women's Wednesday Bible Study


