A message from Reverend Sharlyn

Where Wilderness and the Cross Meet ...

As we leave the month of February and begin the month of March we also begin the season of Lent, starting with Ash Wednesday on March 1st. As always, we will have supper together in the Fellowship Hall before going into the



sanctuary for the introduction to Lent and the imposition of the ashes. As we hear the words "remember you are dust and to dust you shall return" we are reminded of our mortality. As humans, we are frail, we are imperfect, we are so easily tempted. In Lent, we remember how much we need God to rescue us from the sin that so easily snares us. Through the journey of Lent we reflect on how God has rescued his people.

This Lenten Season there will be two focuses, in a way, but both will coincide and finally come to meet together on Maundy Thursday. Each week there will be lessons from the Old Testament as Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt, rescuing them from the bonds of slavery, leading them on the long journey through the wilderness ... a journey that would be full of trials and life lessons about trusting God.

The parallel focus will be on Jesus' journey to the cross and the lessons he teaches about God's kingdom living, finally coming to the cross as God rescues once again, His people from the bonds of slavery - the slavery we get bound up in with the sin that ultimately leads to death. Both lessons remind us of God's plan for the salvation of His people.

On Maundy Thursday I am planning a very special service where, at

last, the wilderness and the cross meet. We will celebrate a modified Passover Meal with a Christian emphasis.

I want to encourage you all to come to the Wednesday night bible studies. These studies will be strongly focused on the Lenten theme and the upcoming Scriptures and lessons that will be preached that upcoming Sunday.

Are you ready for the journey? Pack your bags, but pack light because the journey will be long and sometimes difficult, but that's what wilderness lessons are about. Do not be afraid because it is God who will lead us and always provide what we need. Just bring yourself, your bible, perhaps a journal or notebook to write in. You don't want to forget the lessons. Let's take this trip together, shall we? When we finally meet to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord, we will perhaps view it with even more joy that ever before.

From the Lions' Den

In the last issue, I began to write about the "Great Ends of the Church" found in our Book of Order which summarize the mission of the church:



the proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind;

the shelter, nurture, and spiritual fellowship of the children of God;

the maintenance of divine worship;

the preservation of the truth;

the promotion of social righteousness; and

the exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world.

Last issue, I wrote about "the proclamation of the gospel...." This issue I am going to skip ahead to "the maintenance of divine worship." The worship of God, while third in the list of Great Ends, is the single most important task of the church. It is what distinguishes it from secular organizations and even faith-based enterprises. It is the primary means by which we fulfill the first question of the Westminster Shorter Catechism: "Q. What is the chief end of man? A. The chief end of man is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever."

Presbyterians have been engaged in "worship wars" over the past two generations. As the church has lost its place of privilege in society, lost members, and tried to kick-start renewal, it has experimented with various forms of worship from folk services to healing services to contemplative services to rock concerts. As Presbyterians, we have a particular theology that informs our worship but we do not have a mandated style of worship. The rubrics of worship are found in "The Directory for Worship" in our Book of Order. The central themes of our worship are: The encounter with God mediated through the Word of God in scripture; the acknowledgment of our need for God's grace through confession of sin, and the recognition of that grace through the declaration of God's promises and the administration of sacraments; and our response of gratitude through offering of our lives to God's service in mission to the world.

These themes of Proclamation and Response, of Grace and Gratitude form both the essential shape of our worship as well as of our lives.

At the Presbytery meeting March 6, we will be voting on a major revision to our Directory for Worship. The revision is designed to consolidate what is currently a somewhat rambling and over-regulated Directory. It also lifts up as the organizing principal of our worship that foundational rhythm of grace and gratitude. During our equipping time, we will have the privilege of interacting with the Rev. Dr. David Gambrell



of our General Assembly office of Theology, Worship, and Education, focusing on how the Directory for Worship can benefit the mission of congregations.

God acts in grace toward us, we respond in gratitude to God. It is a simple yet profound summary of the Christian life. The proposed Directory puts it this way:

God acts with grace; we respond with gratitude. God claims us as beloved children; we proclaim God's saving love. God redeems us from sin and death; we rejoice in the gift of new life. This rhythm of divine action and human response-found throughout Scripture, human history, and everyday events-shapes all of Christian faith, life, and worship. (W-1.0102)

May our diverse and creative responses of gratitude for God's grace shape our worship and our lives as the Presbytery of Lake Huron.

Grief Support Group


The grief support group will meet every other week on Wednesday. For
