We are now in the Easter season- finally. Moving through Lent we also moved through some of the greyest, coldest days of the year, weather that serves as a reminder of the gravity of the time leading up to the crucifixion. Though Lent can be difficult and feel long, I am grateful that it is a season we observe, because if we just

arrive at Easter without any preparation, without any sense of what came before, without a focus upon the cross, Easter loses its meaning and its splendor. But now, it is Easter, and the weather is mostly changed to match the spirit of this season of joy.

What I preached on Easter Day, and what I want to emphasize by writing about it in this month's newsletter, is that witnessing to and embodying the resurrection as followers of Christ means seeing the rebirth that is right in front of our eyes, this day, in the ordinary, and even in the midst of all of the great sadness and suffering in which our world is engulfed. I want to encourage us to be open to the new thing, the new creation in which God is bringing forth- in our homes, in this church, in Holly, in our nation, in the world. I want to encourage us to look for the living, as the two men tell the women at the tomb- to recognize that the cross, that suffering is an inseparable part of Jesus' story, but it is not where the story ends. With the Covid-19 pandemic still very much a part of our lives and, now, our histories, with the war in Ukraine, and with other wars and violence raging around the world, causing the displacement of so many innocent people, with our nation divided and hostile and unequal, with so many people of color in this nation fearing that their lives do not matter, with so many children suffering from disruption to their education- all of this pretty much leaves us in the shadow of the looming cross. But Easter reminds us that the cross was not the final word, and life prevailed, and, as Christians, we are charged to be bringers of life to those places where death seems dominant.

Let us start by looking for the living right in our midst, in the small, seemingly insignificant places of our homes, our families, our neighbors, this church. Where do you see signs of life? Where do you see the resurrection breaking through in the ordinary? Remember that this matters. When we are a people who can see the resurrection, who see rebirth, who see new life in the everyday, it has transformative power upon our own souls, and this changes the way we interact in the world. We become healers and peacemakers.
