Thoughts from Matt



We give our very busy Stated Clerk a small break by having a member of Presbytery Council write an article on a regular basis. We are grateful to the Rev. Matt Schramm for his contribution this week. Matt is the Senior Pastor of Midland-Memorial and the Vice Moderator of Presbytery.

I have a grand total of one wrestling win in my athletic career. I won't mention how many losses, but it's more

than one. It was a long time ago — long enough that I wrestled in the 112 pound division — and I only lasted a year. That can probably be attributed to this truth about wrestling that I won't forget: it is hard and it is painful. I heard an interview with a wrestling coach who said that among other things, wrestling is intimate and confrontational.

At MPC we've been studying some of our heritage from the Hebrew Scriptures, including Jacob. Jacob's story has its ups and downs; but, eventually, we come to know him as Israel - One who wrestles with God.

As Christians, our ancestors were the people of Israel. In some spiritual sense, we still bear that name. And we do well to remember it is who we are to be wrestling with God. We pursue an opportunity to have a intimate and confrontational relationship with the one who created and redeemed us, who hears us when we cry out for justice,

who knows us better than we know ourselves, and who loves us anyway.

In the Scriptures, over and over we read of God's people wrestling with God. That holds true from the very beginning and is seen even in the life of Jesus, who shares an intimate and confrontational relationship with his Father. God summons us to that sort of relationship, too. In the first chapter of Isaiah, we hear God's invitation to "come now, let us argue it out" as we work with God to seek justice for all (Isaiah 1:1-18 NRSV).

The life of discipleship is not a walk in the park. It's often a wrestling match. Our congregations and our presbytery are not where the wrestling stops and all is well. Instead, we remind one another that we are not alone as we wrestle with who we are called to be as the people of God. We won't be perfect, but may we be found faithful. God be with you as you seek to serve

Work Day

We are holding a church workday on Saturday, Oct. 7, starting at 10 am. Jim will be there at 9 am if you would like to get an early start. (In the



event of bad weather, our backup date is Oct. 21.) For planning purposes it would be best to know in advance how many are coming. So please **send Jim Lyles an e-mail** at

Bottled water and pre-packaged snacks will be provided. Please bring your own lunch. If you have specific tasks you want to work on, let Jim know that too. (If you don't e-mail/call ahead, you are still welcome to show up that day.)

If you need to bring tools or supplies for a given task they are listed; otherwise the church will provide the items needed. We do recommend bringing work gloves for many of the tasks. Disposable, water-proof gloves will be provided for indoor cleaning tasks.

Exterior:

- 1. Remove screen windows from Fellowship Hall and Sanctuary and install storm windows--CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.
- Fill in cracks in concrete at back entrance area. Also fill the new low spot just south of the handicapped ramp at the back entrance area—CHECK WITH: Broady Cook; he will buy the product needed.
- 3. Landscaping: thorough weeding, planting bulbs, transplanting—CHECK WITH: Charlee Litten or Vicki Lyles.
- 4. Remove maple trees and other junk trees/bushes growing along the east side of the church--CHECK WITH: Charlee Litten or Vicki Lyles.
- 5. Clean up leaves and other debris in the area around the back entrance—NEEDED: lawn blower.
- 6. Lock box with key on Sanctuary basement entrance doorknob is rusty; needs to be lubricated and tested, or eliminated if no longer working—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.
- 7. Replace electrical junction box on the back Sanctuary wall, under the flat roof—CHECK WITH: Randy Cook; he will buy a new box.
- 8. Remove the old duct tape around the office windows and potentially replace it with white duct tape—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.

Upstairs:

- 1. Clean cobwebs at church entrances and where needed throughout the building (also check downstairs).
- 2. Put the fans in the Sanctuary in storage (in the west boiler room).
- 3. Turn on heat at thermostats.
- 4. Caulk stained glass windows in the Sanctuary—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles

Downstairs:

- 1. Remove A/C window unit from Office and move it to the west storage room—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.
- 2. Add plastic to the office and Community Room windows—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.
- 3. Water heater (east boiler room): drain a few gallons of water.
- 4. Water softener (east boiler room): check salt level—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.
- 5. Turn on heat at thermostats.
- 6. Test both sump pumps.


Prayers of Joy
