

# Holly Presbyterian Church Newsletter October 2025

To the Presbytery of Lake Huron:

Like many, I went to church yesterday. I led worship and preached and sang hymns. Then we began to hear about something tragic happening at a church in Grand Blanc. It quickly became apparent that an act of violence, this time with fire and bullets, had descended on the Latter Day Saints congregation there.

And all that I could think was the opening sentence of Psalm 22 – words Jesus cried out from the violence of the cross – "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

And our cries pale next to the cries of those whose lives were forever changed during a worship service. For the victims and their families who will grieve and will always see an empty place. For those who witnessed this horror and those who will try to provide comfort and some sense of safety, no matter how small. For first responders and emergency workers who, despite facing their worst nightmare, courageously and heroically responded as fast as anyone could expect. So many... and so we cry, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

But this is where we begin. Today we do not feel capable or wise. I do not have answers. We do not have answers. We feel forsaken. But we can look to God in our sorrow, our grief, our anger, trusting that God is there. In this darkest time, we cry out to God with nothing but our sorrows. And God meets us and helps us. God does that today. God is doing that in Grand Blanc.

We are not forsaken. It may be a natural to want to ignore what happened yesterday or find a way to numb it or to just not do anything. But as Christians we turn to the Lord in our sorrow and grief. And we keep turning to the Lord, knowing God will help us do what is needed.

We know that gun violence is a scourge on our country. We know God wants all his children to live long and fruitful lives (Isaiah 65:20). The first step is lament, but our second and third steps must work for justice. I would be thankful to hear from you about how we could do this, together, as this part of Christ's body.

Knowing that God accompanies us and gives us strength to live faithfully gives me – give us – hope in the darkest of times. This is the hope that can bring back the light where we need it most.
