On April 4th some Michigan student athletes made the short trip over to Eastern Michigan University to hear Len Vander Bos, the chaplain for the Buffalo Bills share the about the incredible Damar Hamlin story. If you remember, Damar Hamlin is the NFL player who went into cardiac arrest on the field with the nation watching. Amazingly, doctors and trainers were able to restart his heart on the field and he has now made a complete recovery. Len was able to share with a captivated audience of around 120 athletes about the "God" moments from that time and challenge the room to live in light of eternity. It was a powerful night!



A few weeks ago Colby and I attended our national Athletes in Action staff conference where we joined 400+ other AIA staff from around the country at our headquarters in Xenia, OH. The theme of our time was "You Are", reflecting on who God is, who we are, and who He has called AIA to be.

Connecting with and being sharpened by other staff was hugely encouraging and I left feeling like my cup was filled. It truly is a privilege to serve God in this ministry!

Sending off our seniors

I've always said the hardest part of my job is saying goodbye to seniors every spring. After lovingly investing in their lives during their years here, we now entrust them to God and send them off as men and women who will be make an impact in the Kingdom.

This year we had a record number of graduating seniors—29!! We usually spend our last monthly gathering listening to each senior share a bit about how God has intersected their lives in college and what wisdom they would like to pass along to underclassmen. But, with 29 of them, we had to do things a bit differently!

Each senior took time to write something about their faith during their college years which we made available to all the students. We wanted to highlight two stories in particular. Enjoy hearing how faithful and intentional our God is!
