In May, I (Allen) had a brief but exciting trip back to Spain! I joined some coworkers there to handle necessary banking and paperwork for our organization. Before and after the many hours of onsite administrative work. I also got to see, in person, some of what we are building together there, and how the Lord is answering our prayers.

First I met up with E and J, colleagues who Deedee and I have worked with for many years. We visited their warehouse of humanitarian aid, which supplies E's "church on wheels" van ministry to North Africans in need. E and J also use part of the same building to meet with seekers and with new believers for in-person Bible study and discussion (they meet with many others online). They brought me with them to their Arabicspeaking church which they helped start in Malaga. That church has grown so big, they now have two Sunday services!



I visited with our even older colleagues O and V, who also continue to see the Lord change people's lives in Spain and in North Africa. O said he is thankful for getting faculty approval for their special student programs, to teach values, emotional intelligence, maturity and preparation for adult life. V shared news about her women's ministry which meets online since expanding to more places in Spain. At a recent general meeting, two new ladies prayed to accept Jesus as Lord!

Finally on my Spain visit, I met up with four volunteers from the UK who were our first Operation Transit team of the season. It was a joy, despite the rain, to accompany them to the ferry port and help them learn to do outreach there. The North African travelers' openness and receptivity was amazing: three out of the first four people to whom I offered Bible packets accepted them! The team told me how thrilled they were to watch God answer specific prayers for people to be hungry for God's truth and to accept His Word.

Back in France in June, I helped complete and present the final reports from the financial audits my team had done in Central Asia. Thank you for praying for that trip! Before leaving, I received this encouraging note about my previous audit:

I just got off a call with S, and she praised to me how helpful the audit was to her and to the ministry, and how much she appreciated all your practical help. S is not normally so positive, so it must have been something quite extraordinary! Thank you for your service there!
