#### Come as a Child

The church has Christianized that practice in the lighting of the Advent wreath. To us, these candles are signs of the growing light of Christ who is coming again in all fullness into the darkness of our world. Until the dawning of that Great Day, we watch and wait in the Holy Spirit for Christ's coming into the darkness of our world, lighting candles of hope, peace, joy, and love; and remembering the promises of God with prayer.

## Lighting of the Advent Wreath Peace

Watch and wait for Christ's coming! Light candles of hope, peace, joy, and love, remembering the promises of God with prayer.

We light this candle in hope. (The first candle is lit.)

We light this candle for peace. (The second candle is lit.)

This is the season of holy waiting. We wait for the One whose word can set captives free. We watch for the day when all who mourn will know gladness and praise. We wait while the dawning light appears on the horizon.
